Jesus was a person of abundance mentality. Whenever I read the incidence of His first miracle where at the marriage feast wine ran short. According to the Jewish custom it is very shameful if the wedding guests do not get enough wine to drink. The mother of Jesus who was also present at the wedding feast noticed the embarrassment of the family. She rushed to her son to seek for a solution. Jesus agreed to help. What did he do? Jesus ordered the servants to fill the six jars that were kept there for washing of the feet as was the custom in those days. They were filled to the brim. Each jar contained about 75 liters of water. Then what did He do? He just changed it into wine... wine of much better taste than the guests had till then. What an abundance mentality!

Abundance of wine exquisite taste!

More than 450 liters!!



Even today when food run short for our poor children of the hostel we calculate how many did not get and prepare just enough to feed those. Still suffering from 'scarcity' mentality!

Whenever Jesus worked miracles He would give more than what the people needed ... of a better quality than those who requested for help.

Just imagine of a world where we learn to share - those in affluence and abundance – with those in need! There will not be poverty in the world.

The oft raised question: Why poverty in this world? Where is God? The answer lies here. Our scarcity mentality coupled with our selfishness and greed.

The very noble deed of sharing is often contaminated with the desire to be seen and applauded by all. No wonder the Master said: 'When you give with your right hand let not even the right hand know that you are doing such a good deed.'

It is better not to give or share if it is not done with sensitivity, compassion and love. I remember the story of three students who were sent out of class with an assignment of doing a good deed to someone in need and report back. In fact, it was part of a project introduced in the school to develop the culture of solidarity among the students. It was known as 'DAAD REVOLUTION' which invited the students to 'Do An ARK a Day' (DAAD). ARK here meant 'Act of Random Kindness'.

The three students returned to the class after some 20 minutes. The teacher enquired from each one what they did as an Act of Random Kindness. The first one stated without any hesitation that he helped an old lady

Going back to the Master, Jesus was a perfect model of abundance mentality. Whenever people approached Him for healing or any other favour, he would go beyond their request and grant them more than what they would request. When he fed the 5000 people with few loaves and a couple of fish, the left over filled 12 baskets. His abundance had no limits!

It was the same even with his mercy and forgiveness. One of his followers had asked him how many times one should forgive the other. In his abundance the follower asked if he should reach up to seven times. To his surprise the Master replied: "not seven times, but seventy times seven", which meant always.

Research reveals that an average person uses only 10% of his/her energy. Where does the other 90% go? It goes down the drain. Why? Because one suffers from insecurity, fear, or a low self-esteem.

Scarce mentality prevents one from discovering the God-given gifts. He is afraid of taking initiatives to develop them; further he would not deploy them for his own benefits, and much less for those of others.



It is seen again, how a person of scarce mentality tends to be selfish and finds it difficult to share as well. He would rather amass wealth and live in affluence rather than share and make the world a better place to live in.

Do you dream of a better world? Is really another world possible where there could be more love, unity, and sharing? Yes, the answer is in each one moving from a scarce mentality to one of abundance mentality.
